His point being that historically people have understood that momentous times are both trials, and blessings depending on how well one adapts to the challenge. written symbols, but the sentiment is valid. When circumstances make a chaotic mess of our calm day to day life we can either see that chaos as a destructive force that wipes away the good, or as an opportunity to build better.

I always feel like the New Year somehow is a bit of a crisis. All of the progress of the last year comes with us, but somehow it feels like we are also starting at square one...for better and worse. Every year we all feel that newness goading us to make better choices, healthier actions, smarter decisions. Hopefully we see last year's failings as a lesson to inform this new year, and not as a gloomy harbinger of future failure. We always have the chance to start over and do better. Even as we face greater challenges than remembering a new year date to write on all of our checks we may see the opportunities that abound.

But, most of us don't face challenges and crises with a smile and a spring in our step as we tell ourselves, "look at this marvelous opportunity!" Because, of course, a crisis almost always means the end of something we value. Maybe it is our health, a relationship, financial security, or even the loss of a loved one. All of these crises are validly sad, all of them are validly frightening. The loss of something precious is a valid place to experience grief. But after grief, then what?

Do we remain in our grief or do we look for the opportunity in the crisis? Yes, something we treasure may have ended, but every act of creation is an act of destruction, and every act of destruction is an act of creation. Think of it this way, when an artist paints a picture the first thing they have to do is destroy a blank canvas. From the moment the brush touches the canvas the change has been made and that blank canvas will never be a perfect white square again. When we begin the construction of a building we call it "breaking ground", as in, the ground is now broken and will never go back to what it was. What is the first step of a home remodel? Demolition. We fear a crisis because we know what came before it, but we do not know what comes after it.

To find peace in the chaos is to remind ourselves that we may not know what comes after the crisis/opportunity....but we know who was there before, during, and will be after. The author of the Book of Hebrews says, "So we say with confidence, "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can mere mortals do to me?" Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13). Know that we have a savior who will walk through our deepest, chaotic crisis and support us with his love and strength when we need it most. So have a happy New Year, crisis, opportunity, and future.

Happy New Year! While I haven't finished the books for 2023 yet, it appears we will have a similar situation to previous years where expenditures outpace our revenues by a decent amount. We are still waiting to receive our Employee Retention Credit, which will help greatly. The ABC Center did receive a grant for \$89,000 in December, which will cover a good portion of their shortfall for 2023. I will get into all the details on numbers in the annual report in a couple of weeks.

On a personal note, after 17 years with my accounting firm in Dublin, I have decided to open my own practice. It is certainly kind of sad, a little scary, and certainly exciting. For those of you who don't know, the Church has contracted with my previous accounting firm to essentially have me as a Treasurer. So now it will be contracting with my new firm, and nothing will change on the service end of things. I spoke with Pastor and the Finance Committee, and they were okay with me operating my practice out of the Church office building. My hope is that if I can grow the firm a little bit, I can make enough money to cover the expenses the Church has from maintaining this building. If anyone has any questions or thoughts, I am certainly all ears and open to your opinion. Additionally, while I don't want to take clients from my neighboring accounts and I don't want to mooch off all my friends at Church, if anyone is in need of any accounting or tax services, I would love to chat with you. As it is a little scary going out on my own, I am grateful for any support. Thank you so much for everything!
