Grace and peace to you from Christ our Lord,

Spring, like all times of transition, is full of potential and uncertainty. For those of us just trying to plant our garden the uncertainty is more centered on whether the rain will stop long enough, and the ground dry enough, for us to get seeds in the ground that don't rot. But, for our young people graduating from one grade to another, or even entirely out of school, the future's variable outcomes are much more high stakes. How to choose the right classes, how to choose the right career, how to choose the right spouse, and on and on the decisions go. In the end the outcome is a bit more serious than whether or not my tomatoes will produce early or late. Increasingly our young folks have to make these trying decisions without the benefit of faith or God's direction. It is little wonder that Generation Alpha (Kids born after 2013) are being renamed "Generation Anxiety" by public health officials who estimate that a full 60% of kids (Psychology Today, Clay Drinko, Ph.D.) in that generation are suffering from clinical levels of anxiety and/or depression. I believe the cause is directly related to the decline in faith.

Humans simply are not designed to live without faith. In the absence of God's direction every fear and doubt become an insurmountable challenge. Even Dr. Richard Dawkins, the famously outspoken English atheist writer, has recently complained that society seems to be collapsing without the benefit of the Christian faith. He has gone so far as to describe himself now as a cultural Christian, or a non-practicing Christian, and is encouraging others to at least embrace the Christian worldview. This strikes me as similar to someone who burns their house down and then complains that they have nowhere to sleep. However, it certainly drives home the point when even the most outspoken opponent of Christianity in the 20th century is nostalgic for the good old days when Christianity was holding the fabric of society together.

For people who live surrounded by vast wealth and treasure it is easy to lose sight of the value of such fortune. We often wonder why millionaires (and now billionaires) never seem to appreciate the scope of their good fortune, and yet...Here we are surrounded by the inestimable wealth of God's grace, love, and wisdom. Do we recognize the riches we live with daily? Increasingly the spiritually impoverished world we live in crowds around us showing us the true deprivations that those without Christ suffer.

If we wake to the poverty of the world we live in and see the vast sea of wealth we swim in daily, we must be motivated to reach out and offer hope and rescue to this failing world. We do so not because we are better than the world we live in, but because we know that we ourselves have been saved by the riches of grace we enjoy.

Hi Everyone,

First off, thank you everyone for your patience with me as I navigated my first tax season owning my own firm. It was quite the learning experience! I am still digging my way out of the tax season backlog, but it does appear that revenues for Lent were down a little this year, and post Easter has not been stellar either. I do want to thank all of the volunteers who are working so hard to staff the office. Our office hasn't been this busy since before Covid, and we wouldn't be able to do this financially with a paid staff person right now. So, my deepest thanks to all of you who are giving your time to keep this place open. While our operating costs are exceeding our revenues, we do still have a cash balance which is invested in CD's which will help offset the costs. We have not heard anything yet on our amended payroll returns to claim the Employee Retention Credit. Hopefully we will get good news on that front soon. On the ABC side, we are still showing some small losses, but nothing compared to our losses last year. We are working on some marketing efforts to really bump up our numbers for the summer season.

On May 3rd Jane will be celebrating her 99th Birthday. Jane married Ed (deceased) on September 23, 1947. She and Ed raised two children, Janice (deceased) and Fred.

Jane's profession was nursing. As a nurse she was involved in many people's lives working in hospitals, private duty nursing, Public Health and the Tuby where she often worked 7 days a week. She was also a past president of the MedCentral Health System Alumni Association.

One of Jane's favorite pass times is genealogy. She has been the person that has spent much time keeping up with family genealogy and is very knowledgeable about each family member.

Secondly, Jane is our oldest surviving member of the First Lutheran Shelby. She was very involved at Lutheran Church, Plymouth and then First Lutheran, Shelby. She wore several hats volunteering at First including Altar Guild, Bible School teacher and helping with Catechism to name a few. She truly enjoyed helping with Catechism and talks often about the students she helped out.

One aspect of Jane's Christian life that she took very seriously and to this day is extremely proud of was during the time when she attended First Lutheran in Plymouth. The local schools were banning the teaching of Christianity within the school system. Her church started a weekday bible school class which Jane had a big part in developing and also taught a class.
