

FINANCE – Brian Crum, Treasurer

Hi Everyone,

Well, I have mixed news for the financial side of things. The Church offering actually exceeded expenses by about \$200 in July. We still have \$47,000 in our contingency fund and another \$32,000 in undesignated memorials. So, on the one hand, things are looking okay. Unfortunately, we have still lost \$20,000 for the year, and I expect to lose another \$10,000 in August because offering was down a tad, and it is a three-pay month. So, we still have a little money in the bank, but we definitely need to do some planning to try and keep our heads above water. Additionally, we have had some pretty expensive repair costs on the building this year and the property fund is negative by about \$9,000. I was hoping that this would correct as the offering came in during the year, but I don't really see that happening due to normal expenditures. So, I will talk with the finance committee regarding whether we should do a fundraising drive to catch up that fund or pull it from our contingency fund. I have a similar issue with the youth group fund as my programming has put us behind by about \$2,000. On the ABC front, June and July were just about break-even months and the organization has a cash balance of \$257,000. August will be a bit of a rough month with three payrolls, and we need to work on getting more kids, but it is hanging in there.

Okay, now that I have depressed everyone, let's talk about some fun stuff. The youth group has had some fun this month. After the ice cream social, we hosted a slip and slide kickball game. We probably had a little less than 20 people attend, including not just our normal kids, but a couple kids from our bus stop as well as a few kids from the ABC Center. I am working really hard to include both of those groups in our activities as I interact with them daily. Last weekend we took 16 people (this time all church members) to Cedar Point for sort of a youth group kickoff party. We had an absolute blast, and I am so looking forward to working with the kids this year.

On the bus stop ministry side of things, we have kicked off the school year and are seeing a lot more activity in the building. A special thanks to everyone who helped to put together hygiene bags for the kids. Those went over really well. Most of these kids also attended the carnival and got school supplies from us, so thank you to everyone who was a part of that too. These things really do make a difference. These kids are starting to integrate with the kids from the youth group, and I do feel like they will start joining us more as the year goes on.

In other outreach items, while Pastor and I did not manage to get a young adult bible study kicked off in August like discussed, fall is a slower time of year for my work, so I hope that I can make some phone calls to our young population to see what we can do to get them more involved. I am also doing more with our daycare kids and hope to include those families too.

So, all in all, there is a lot of great stuff going on in my little corner of things. I am so grateful for every minute being a part of this family, and I appreciate you guys putting up with me! Sincerely, Brian

IN THE SPOTLIGHT

GOING BACK IN TIME...THE YEAR IS 1859...THE HISTORY OF OUR CHURCH

Early in the summer of 1859 Rev. John Stough of Ashland was approached by several Shelby Lutherans and asked about the possibility of establishing a Lutheran church in Shelby. The first services were held in the homes of interested families. On September 1, 1859, a service was held for the purpose of organizing the organizing the congregation and the First Lutheran Church of Shelby became an official body. There were forty charger members.

The congregation grew and it was soon necessary for the new congregation to arrange their own church building. This building was dedicated in September 1867. The congregation was incorporated on February 25, 1898.

Rev. William H. Singley, D.D., had been called in November 1898, "with the understanding that he should put forth every effort to erect a new church b building which would be large enough and convenient enough to accommodate the work of the congregation". On June 20, 1898, work was begun to move the first building to the rear of the lot and the cornerstone for the new church was laid on August 28, 1898. This building was dedicated on March 12, 1899.

On January 30, 1926, Rev D. Bruce Young accepted our call and at that time the congregation had a membership of 827 and there was enrollment of 736 in the Sunday school. During Rev. Young's pastorate an Educational Building was completed and dedicated on October 1, 1939.

At a congregational meeting, held January 22, 1956, the congregation accepted the recommendation of the Centennial Committee that the present building be demolished, and a new Church be built on the same location. The last services in the old building were held on May 12, 1956.

On September 7, 1958, Cornerstone Laying Services were held at the new church site and the building was dedicated on May 19, 1959.

On December 31, 1962, Dr D. Bruce Young retired from the active ministry. He had completed fifty years in the ministry and for thirty-seven of those years he served as pastor of First Lutheran of Shelby.

Rev. James L Lumadue accepted our call and on December 8, 1963, conducted his first service as pastor.

The history of a church is necessarily concerned with dates and building programs, and it is not possible to confine the true worth of a church within such things. Its purpose is to sincerely witness to the glory of God, to renew and increase I us the gift of the Holy Spirit, to our strengthening in faith and to our growth in grace. Through the efforts of many people the First Lutheran Church of Shelby has done this, and this is its real history.

The" History of our Church" was taken from our first church directory. Date of printing and author of this article are unknown.
