At its best, this season inspires us to acts of kindness and generosity. At its worst, it drives us to overburden our lives with unrealistic expectations, pressures, and financial burdens. Like too many things, the season can become overwhelmed with too much of a good thing.

I would like to suggest an idea that I am calling "Hallmark decorations". If you have ever watched a Hallmark Christmas movie (and who hasn't) you may have noticed that the homes are all beautifully decorated. My wife and I have spent time analyzing what makes the homes in these movies so lovely. It isn't that the decorations are sparse, but at the same time, they are not cluttered or overwhelming. Usually, it is one or two simple things like garlands, trees, or white lights, that are clearly high quality, carefully arranged, consistent, and natural looking.

I want to suggest that our own homes...and more importantly our hearts, would do well to follow the "Hallmark decoration" rules. The season does not need to be cram-packed with events, presents, expectations, and pressures. It is enough that we choose the simple beauty of celebrating Christ's birth and keep it as our centerpiece. After that, we can hang some garlands of grace (and don't we all need an extra measure of grace this time of year) and sprinkle liberally of God's love to be the light that illuminates the season. # FINANCE – Brian Crum, Treasurer

While we are just closing November as of the time this Enlightener is being completed, I wouldn't expect anything out of the ordinary on the financial side. Based on what I have seen so far, I would say that we will probably have small losses from operations for both the Church and ABC Center for the period. We did receive a \$52,000 check from the IRS for the amended 2020 quarterly payroll tax return to claim the Employee Retention Credit. We hope to see checks for the three quarters from 2021 sometime in 2025.

The youth group is going very well. In November we had a lesson by Pastor at the Well coffee shop, did our Angel Tree shopping trip, helped setup for the Thanksgiving meals, and had an awesome lesson that Cassie put together at the Church. December is shaping up to be a blast with a trip to Columbus Zoo lights, a Christmas lesson, and then a Christmas party overnight. Cassie has spearheaded planning for Winter which involves a lot of great activities, leading with a trip to Columbus for a Christian music concert. We have had very good attendance this year with the kids bringing a lot of friends. We have also gained three regulars from our bus stop ministry.

Speaking of the bus stop ministry, that is also going very well. As stated, many of them now feel comfortable enough to join us for our youth group and other Church activities. We have received a Thrivent grant to purchase hygiene products for them, and we will be shortly putting together some additional Christmas gift baskets for them to get on their last day of school. They were extremely appreciative of the hats, gloves, and scarves that were donated as well. I'm having a blast working with these kids, albeit it certainly opens my eyes as to the rough time many of our neighborhood kids have getting through life. We are always in need of snacks if anyone wants to throw in their cart at the grocery store a box of little Debbie snacks, individually wrapped chips, granola bars, pop tarts, fruit snacks, etc. I am going to brainstorm some ways that we can further help these kids and hopefully integrate them with our activities with Pastor Rus in the youth group leaders in the near future. I will keep you all posted!


