I am still finishing the Church's financials for November, but it appears that offering has ticked up a little over the last 6 weeks, so I am hopeful that we will have just a small loss on the Church side. The ABC Center had a net income of about \$3,000 for November, which is pretty close to what it needs to be financially viable for the year. So that is promising!

Youth group stayed busy in December. Last weekend we had a Christmas Party overnight, which saw about 10 kids, the majority of whom were guests or new participants. We also had Pastor do a lesson during the month went to the movie theater to watch "The Best Christmas Pageant Ever," which was a fabulous Christian film that gave the kids a lot to think about. January will be very busy for youth group with a highlight being the Christian concert on OSU campus the last Saturday of the month. Cassie and Cece put together a schedule for winter and spring, and I am really excited to spend the time with the kids.

We also have had a lot of fun with the bus stop ministry in the last couple months. It is interesting to see the interactions with the different age groups. The elementary aged kids are now spending time in our makeshift living room in the morning while waiting for the bus. In the afternoon those kids generally just grab a snack and run. The real kicker is the middle and high school students. I have about 10 of them that, even though the bus doesn't drop them off by the building, make their way over anyway, and instead of grabbing a snack, they have a tendency to hang out. Four of them are actually now attending youth group events and the Saturday morning breakfast. I am really happy to spend that time with them. We put together small Christmas presents for the kids as well, which was greatly appreciated. We received a grant for hygiene products from Thrivent and will be distributing those in January. We are always in needs of breakfast and afternoon snacks if anyone is interested. When the planning began several years prior to completion, the target was to have the new sanctuary done for Easter in 1959 and have confirmation in the church. It was close, but it took a couple more months before it was actually done. That did not stop our congregation from celebrating in April of that year.

As I was going through pictures, I found two pictures of the sanctuary where the walls were still cement block, and people were sitting on chairs and benches. There's a third picture taken a few months later where the sanctuary had its new pews, and the walls were finished. There is also a photo of the church social hall lined with those old heavy tables, and hundreds of our members enjoying a luncheon celebrating the new church. The question is, did this meet fire code?
