Grace and Peace to you from Christ our Lord,

The words, "polar vortex" are now rather firmly in the common vernacular of the American press. For those of you who have, somehow, missed this phrase it refers to the swirling winds that keep the extremely cold air of the poles up at the poles...not wandering down to make it snow in Florida. Over the last few years, those vortexes have not done their job very well, and we have suffered some icy blasts of frigid weather. In fact, we have just begun to find our way out of some of that misplaced polar air. No one much likes the weather when it is ten below, and with a wind chill that dips well below the negative twenty mark we all huddle in our homes and hope we don't need to go outside for anything. My wife recently remarked to me that we should put some ice melt on the front sidewalk at my house because it had lots of ice on it... I laughed about that because I had already put two bags out...and nothing was melting.

Unfortunately for me, I have animals that live outdoors...chickens to be precise. For the record, between the under layer of down, and the top layer of water-resistant, air-trapping feathers chickens effectively are wearing down parkas all winter long... but even with their exceptional resistance to cold, twenty below wind chills present a real health risk for them. So, I put on my best ski jacket, gloves, hat, scarf, extra socks...the works...and ventured out into the cold to do what I could for them. I built a windbreak in their run using bales of straw. I added an old dog house to the run for a little shelter when they were out of the coop. I made sure the heater in their water supply was working. I added black oil sunflower seeds to their feed (the extra fat and protein helps them stay warm). I even added a heat lamp to their coop (something I usually am deeply opposed to for fire prevention reasons). In short, I did everything I could to make their environment safe. Of course, the rest is up to them. Despite what you may think, chickens are actually pretty smart as animals go. They have some pretty good instincts and usually make the right choices for survival. And, my girls did all the right things and everyone seems healthy.

Of course, they could have gone and stood in the snow and gotten frostbite on their feet and combs. They could have wandered around in the wind and frozen solid. They could have pecked at the power cord for the heater and burned down the coop....And I know people who have had birds do exactly those things. My gals made good choices and so, I will have eggs and they won't be chickensicles.

In many ways, this is how God has to deal with us. He tells us what to do, and not to do. He creates institutions like the church and creates instructions like the Bible. He even put on human flesh and trudged out into the cold to do the hard work himself, even to the point of dying on a cross. The world is a

cold, dangerous place and God has done everything to keep us safe short of taking us out of it. Even with all of that, the outcome is still up to us. Why do some people stand out in the freezing cold, ignoring the shelter and safety of God's grace? Maybe there are just birds that won't allow themselves to be helped. Maybe the flock hasn't done a good job including all the stragglers and gathering them in. Maybe some folks have had encounters with the "pecking order" and found themselves feeling driven away. We need to do what we can to make sure that all of God's effort to provide all we need does not go to waste on account of our lack of attention. So, what can you do to make sure the lost and wandering don't wind up out in the cold?
