"Grace and Peace to you from Christ our Lord,

It always strikes me as amusing how little we Christians often know about facets of church life that are simultaneously ubiquitous in our lives and utterly foreign. For instance, the section of the church building that extends from the narthex to the chancel (the place where the congregation sits) is called the "Nave". The word nave in Latin means "ship"....why do we call it "a ship"? The answer lies in the fact that the ceiling of that section of the building often would be accomplished using shipbuilding techniques as the arched roof used the same methods as making the curved bow of a ship. So next Sunday as you sit in the pew think of the upside-down ship overhead.

Take the word "amen", or in the original Hebrew "אָמֶן". We say it at the end of a prayer much the way we might say goodbye at the end of a conversation or "The End" at the conclusion of a movie. But in the original language, it means "this is most certainly true". There is nothing final or concluding about it. In fact, it almost leaves one wondering what else you are about to say. Just think if someone ended a statement with the phrase "I'm telling you the truth"... you might wonder what they might say next.

In 1 Thessalonians 5 St. Paul says, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" and we might rightly wonder how one is supposed to not cease from prayer? After all, when you are done with one prayer and say your "amen" are you supposed to start a new one? Or, maybe St. Paul, whose first languages would have been Hebrew and a local Hebrew dialect (Aramaic) would have thought of "amen" less as the period at the end of a sentence and more of a semicolon that implies that more is to come. Maybe we need to understand all of our lives as an ongoing conversation with God. Praying without ceasing may be less about never opening our eyes and saying amen, and more about being intentional in including God in all that we say and do as though He is always a part of every thought, action, or decision.... because he is.

So, I say to you, Amen.

Even though Church Council has been able to keep expenses beneath the anticipated disbursements, our expenses in the Current Fund are over \$24,000 more than our receipts. The Current Fund consists of our day-to-day operating expenses and does not include benevolence or major property improvements. Over \$19,000 has been transferred from undesignated funds in order to meet these expenses. In these undesignated funds we have only \$19,000 left to transfer.

We are optimistic, however concerned about the present critical condition of our Current Funds.

If we want to continue the quality ministry that we enjoy, then we must respond to the needs and support our mission. We ask that you use the enclosed envelope to begin your increased financial support for your church for the balance of this year!

A letter from our new Council President...Pam Blankenhorn

My seven grandchildren are Michael and Kyle Prewitt, Jonah and Rachel Blankenhorn, Rebekah and Leah Case and Ethan Cook.

Our son Aaron was a minister at Trinity English Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne, Indiana until his fatal accident in October of 2006.
