

I. The Robert And Mary Ellen Boor Scholarship of First-Lutheran Church is established in recognition of the on-going need for well-trained Christian young people to step into positions of responsibility and influence.

II. The scholarship is for students who:

1. are members of First Lutheran Church of Shelby, Ohio
2. have an active spiritual life.
3. have a generous and loving spirit.
4. have graduated from high school or graduating the year received.
5. have been accepted by an accredited institution of higher learning.
6. will be a Christian influence on others by example of their lives.

III. All students actively engaged in the pursuit of their studies and who meet the above requirements may apply for the scholarship.

IV. The Initial Gift for the scholarship principal is to be \$13,000.00.

V. The principal of the scholarship fund is to be placed in a saving account or certificate of deposit with a local bank for the sole purpose of providing scholarship money.

VI. The fund will be administered by the Church Council, the selection committee, and the senior pastor.

VII. The amount of the scholarship will be \$1,000.00.

VIII. The scholarship will be awarded to one person per year.

IX. A statement of availability of the scholarship (an invitation to apply) will be publicized (i.e., printed in the church Bulletin, Newsletter, etc....)

X. A selection committee, made of members of First Lutheran Church who are actively associated with young people in the Church and at their schools, will be appointed by the pastor when the Church council appoints standing committees each year.

XI. The number of the members on the selection committee will be established by the pastor.

XII. The selection committees will accept applications for the scholarship from February through April of each year.

XIII. The method of selection will be left to the committee, with the senior pastor making the final approval.

XIV. The presentation of the scholarship will be made on a Sunday named by the senior pastor.

XV. A copy of the following letter will be presented to the awardee at the same time.

A LIVING GIFT

College-bound high school seniors and presently-enrolled college students could receive assistance through a scholarship fund our church has established by the late Pastor Jim and Sallie Lumadue. The scholarship fund is to help with college expenses. The following criteria will be the guidelines a committee follows in selecting a person.

Applications can be made by having each student pick up a form at the church office from February 1 through April 30, and stating why they should be considered as this year's recipient. A selection committee will be appointed at the Congregation Council's Organizational Meeting, February 11, 2020.

Anyone wishing to add monies to this scholarship fund may do so as long as they understand that the guidelines as outlined will be used.

1. The JAMES & SALLIE LUMADUE SCHOLARSHIP OF FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH is established in recognition of the on-going need for well-trained Christian young people to step into positions of responsibility and influence.
2. The scholarship is FOR STUDENTS who:
 - A. Are members of First Lutheran Church, Shelby, Ohio
 - B. Have an active spiritual life
 - C. Have a generous and loving spirit
 - D. Have graduated from high school
 - E. Have been accepted at an accredited institution of higher learning, especially Wittenberg & Ashland Universities, or Trinity Lutheran Seminary
 - F. Intend to enter a profession in which Christian principles will be applied, such as the Gospel ministry, or public/parochial education, but not limited to these professions, and
 - G. Will be a Christian influence on others by the example of their lives.
3. All students actively engaged in the pursuit of their studies and who meet the above requirements MAY APPLY for the scholarship.
4. The INITIAL GIFT for the scholarship principal is to be \$5,000.
5. The PRINCIPAL of the scholarship fund is to be placed in a Certificate of Deposit with a local bank, and RETAINED for the sole purpose of providing scholarship money.
6. The fund will be ADMINISTERED by the Congregation Council, the selection committee and the senior pastor.

7. The AMOUNT of the scholarship will be the amount which is the year's interest (June-June) on the principal of the scholarship fund.
8. The scholarship will be awarded to ONE PERSON each year.
9. A STATEMENT OF AVAILABILITY of the scholarship (an invitation to apply) will be publicized (i.e. printed in the church bulletin, newsletter, etc.) each Sunday in January.
10. A SELECTION COMMITTEE made up of members of First Lutheran Church who are actively associated with young people in the Church and at their schools, will be appointed by the pastor when the Congregation Council appoints standing committees each year.
11. The NUMBER of members on the selection committee will be established by the pastor.
12. The selection committee will accept APPLICATIONS for the scholarship from February through April of each year.
13. The METHOD OF SELECTION will be left to the committee, with the senior pastor making the final approval.
14. The PRESENTATION of the scholarship will be made on a Sunday named by the senior pastor.
15. A letter will be presented to the awardee at the time of the presentation.

RUBY SCHIMPF and ESTHER SMITH SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

This Scholarship Fund was established in memory of Esther Smith and Ruby Schimpf and in recognition of well-trained Christian people who intend to further their education by attending college. Esther taught for 44 years starting at Oak Harbor, Marion, Ontario, Madison and retired from Pioneer in Shelby. Ruby Schimpf taught for 33 years, starting in Lemoyne, Shiloh, Tiro and Shelby, most of which were at Dowds Elementary School.

Anyone who is working toward a college degree and who is presently enrolled in an Ohio College may receive assistance through this scholarship. The following criteria will be the guidelines a committee follows in selecting a person.

Applications can be made by picking up a form at the church office from February 1 through April 30, and stating why they should be considered as this year's recipient. The application should also include the college, the major, the GPA, etc.

The \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to one person each on a Sunday named by the pastor.
